



General Chapter Chartering FAQ

Q: Why hasn't my school been officially chartered?

A: No chapter has been "chartered" - which is credentialed for voting for the 2016-2017 academic year. Chartering will be due 30 days before annual Spring CCR Convention.

Q: Why won't CCR recognize my chapter?

A: CCR is inclusive of all College Republicans. Therefore, every CR chapter is automatically "recognized" and has immediate access to the support, communication, and resources provided by CCR.

Q: What is the deadline to submit our chapter's chartering?

A: Chapter chartering will be due 30 days before CCR Spring Convention 2017.

Q: Where do I submit chartering information?

A: Complete chartering information is to be sent to the CCR Administrative Vice Chair, Kerida Moates, at Kerida.Moates@CollegeGOP.org

Q: Is there a mechanism to ensure that chartering information is independently verified?

A: Chapter chartering information will be audited by an independent third party to ensure that chartering information is accurate and valid.

Q: Isn't CCR required to charter my chapter upon submission of chartering materials?

A: Although the CCR Constitution indicates that the CCR Executive Committee "may" issue charters prior to CCR Convention, this is only utilized in rare cases where a voting matter may arise throughout the year.

Q: What if CCR rejects my chapter's charter?

A: If you follow the instructions that will be sent out in the coming days regarding chartering, there is no reason that CCR should deny your chapter's charter. Decisions to approve or deny a chapter's charter can be appealed to the Executive Committee.

Q: What if my chapter doesn't want to charter?

A: Chapters are not required to charter. Any chapter that does not submit chartering materials still
